That's obvious, but what's not is that if you press the center of the thumb nubbin again, it will return instantly to the off-center sensor you had selected! Now in AI Focus, it waits a moment, but will always start refocusing if the subject moves — or if you recompose. They are indicated by little ticks inside the larger boxes. I don't use them.
